Deputy Commissioner, Chief Fleet Officer, **City of New York**

Commissioner at the Department of Citywide Administrative Services (DCAS) and New York City's first Chief Fleet Officer. Keith is an agency lead for Mayor de Blasio's Vision Zero initiative to eliminate traffic fatalities in NYC and is currently spearheading a series of safety initiatives for the city's fleet. New York City has the largest municipal fleet in the United States with over 30,000 vehicles, 80,000 fleet operators, and more than 2,000 staff engaged in fleet operations and servicing. It also has one of the greenest fleets in the nation, with more than 17,000 vehicles operating on some type of alternative fuel including hybrids, electric, compressed natural gas, and biodiesel.

Ann-Marie Knegt, Managing Editor Local Authority Plant and Vehicles and organiser of The Future Fleet Forum

She has turned her titles into market-leading publications with global social media presence over the last 15 years. Ann-Marie launched the successful Future Fleet Forum. Rory leads the Road Danger Reduction and Behaviour Change team, which works with fleet operators, construction sites, motorcycle groups, City employers, and people who walk and cycle, to improve the safety of all road users in the Square Mile. The group developed the City Mark programme, enhancing the implementation of CLOCS in the City. In the summer, we delivered Lunchtime Streets, creating a traffic-free environment on busy streets to allow people to enjoy lunch in a safer, more pleasant environment.

Rory has previously worked for a variety of organisations, including PTRC (CILT UK), ITDP China and Giant Bicycles.



Steve Rapanos

City Operations/Manager Fleet and Facilities, **City of Edmonton**

Steve leads the Fleet and Facility Services team of 1,250 employees who maintain and manage over 5,000 vehicles and equipment, more than 900 City-owned buildings such as libraries and recreation centres, and over 700 additional infrastructure amenities including park spray decks, splash pads, and river valley footbridges.

Throughout his career, Steve has served on several industry boards and committees. He has been recognised nationally and internationally for his work with Fleet Maintenance and Emergency Medical Services.



Eric Richardson DCFMO Deputy Chief Fleet Officer, New York City

Eric Richardson first entered the world of fleet in 2002 via the information technology side managing NYC's first citywide fleet management system. He coordinated special projects including working on the upgrade of the citywide fleet management system, the citywide replacement of fuel cards for over 12,000 vehicles and 24/7 fueling with the National Guard after Superstorm Sandy. As a member of the Vision Zero Task Force,Eric is continuing work on the largest municipal roll-out of truck side guards, a robust vehicle telematics program, and ensuring that all of the city's non-emergency authorised drivers have taken the New York State authorised defensive driving program.



Philippe Saint-Vil Head of Rolling Stock,

City of Montreal

Since 2015, Philippe has assumed the role of Head of Planning and Operations Support Division at the rolling stock department and workshops of the City of Montreal. He is in charge of the acquisition of municipal vehicles and equipment and the planning of preventive maintenance. Philippe is the author of the 3rd Green rolling stock policy 2016-2020 and is monitoring the electrification plan for the Montreal municipal fleet. The City of Montreal has one of the largest municipal fleets in Canada with more than 7600 vehicles and nearly 400 employees engaged in maintenance and upkeep. The City of Montreal, which has taken the shift towards electrification since 2017, is the first city in Canada for the size of its fleet of electric vehicles.

James Tate

Associate Professor, Institute for Transport Studies, **University of Leeds**

Dr James Tate researches the evolution of road transport fleets and its air quality impacts. He has established himself as a leading International road transport emissions and urban air quality academic. His research innovations include pioneering the use of vehicle emissions remote sensing measurements in the UK, which helped expose the underperformance of modern diesel vehicles emission controls. He uses his knowledge and research capability to design, realise and assess the impact of Clean Air Zones, whilst also promoting Low Emission Vehicles. He is helping shape the UK Air Quality strategy through projects with DEFRA, DfT and Transport for London.



Ruth Waring Director, BigChange Advisory Plus

Ruth has 30 years' experience in the transport and logistics sector, starting her career with Exel Logistics as a Graduate Trainee in 1989 in France and the UK, then promoted to Traffic Manager.
